


What to expect with your

Covid-19 Vaccine

Before | During | After



- Make a vaccine appointment online @ vaccines.gov.
- Pfizer & Moderna require two shots so make sure you have two appointments scheduled.



• Do you need help with the application or transportation Call DIAL: The Disability Information and Assistance Line: **888-677-1199**



- The Vaccine is free.
- You will need to **show your ID**.
- You do not need insurance, a driver's license or a social security number.



- Wear a mask that covers your mouth and nose.
- Wear a t-shirt, the shot will be in your upper arm.




• Learn what will happen during and after the appointment and **plan ahead:** Bring anything that may help ease anxiety like a fidget spinner, squishy, comfort item, preferred video, etc.



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
• **Know the clinic rules for arrival** (will you call from the car, wait in the car, wait in the waiting room, etc.)



• The nurse will use a cold and wet pad to clean your arm.



• Then the shot will be administered on your upper arm.



You will receive a bandaid.



 Before you leave, you will be asked to wait for 15-20 minutes for observation.



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- You will get a vaccination card that tells you which COVID-19 vaccine you received, and when and where you received it.
- Keep it safe!



- You may feel tired, warm, or have pain in your arm.
- These are normal symptoms that will go away soon.

- If you received the Pfizer or Moderna vaccines, the card will remind you to **return for a second dose**.
- Boosters are available months after your second vaccine.
- You can mix and match these vaccines.



 You will be fully vaccinated 2 weeks after your second vaccine.
